

## STO FINANCIAL AID UPDATE

I would like to provide a year-end report on our area's School Tuition Organization (STO) 2022 campaign. Many of you know sending children to a Christian school requires a significant financial commitment. Many families that have children enrolled in a Christian school and here at CICS could not do so if it wasn't for tuition assistance programs.

There is a great way for you to help these families while helping yourself, through an STO. CICS belongs to the Legacy of Grace (LOG) STO, whose sole purpose is to assist these families who desire a Christian education. The Legacy of Grace Student Tuition Organization (LOG/STO) is once again actively seeking donations in 2023 and is in its 17th year of existence for the purpose of raising funds to provide tuition scholarships for eligible students to attend a Christian school.

The blessing to the families is a Christian education for their children, and the blessing to its donors in helping them is they receive a 75% tax credit toward their state income tax. The STO is a fantastic way to divert tax dollars to support families who desire a choice in their education.

Since 2007, the LOG/STO has distributed 6 million dollars in tuition assistance to families attending Christian schools in our area. For 2022, a goal of \$551,000 was set to raise and donate to area families. On January 10, the director of LOG/STO reported \$544,507.78 was given by individuals who believe Christian education is vital in a child's life!
